

While shepherds watched their flocks by night

This Christmas hymn written by Nahum Tate is a paraphrase of Luke 2 v 8 – 14. This tells how angels appeared to some shepherds in fields near Bethlehem.

The relevant Bible verses from Luke's gospel are followed by the paraphrase.

Luke 2 v 8 & 9

And there were shepherds living out in the fields near by, keeping watch over their flocks at night. An angel of the Lord appeared to them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were terrified.

1 While shepherds watched their flocks by night, all seated on the ground, the angel of the Lord came down, and glory shone around.

Luke 2 v 9 & 10

.....the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were terrified. But the angel said to them, 'Do not be afraid. I bring you good news that will cause great joy for all the people.

2 'Fear not,' said he (for mighty dread had seized their troubled mind); 'glad tidings of great joy I bring to you and all mankind.

In John 1 v 9 we read:

The true light that gives light to everyone was coming into the world.

Luke 2 v 11 & 12

Today in the town of David a Saviour has been born to you; he is the Messiah, the Lord. This will be a sign to you:

3 'To you in David's town this day is born of David's line a Saviour, who is Christ the Lord; and this shall be the sign:

This is foretold in Isaiah 9 v 6:

For to us a child is born,
to us a son is given,
and the government will be on his shoulders.
And he will be called
Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God,
Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace.

Luke 2 v 12

....'you will find a baby wrapped in cloths and lying in a manger.'

4 'the heavenly babe you there shall find to human view displayed, all meanly wrapped in swathing bands, and in a manger laid.'

In Matthew 1 v 23 we read, "The virgin will conceive and give birth to a son, and they will call him Immanuel" (which means "God with us").

Luke 2 v 13

Suddenly a great company of the heavenly host appeared with the angel, praising God and saying,

5 Thus spake the seraph; and forthwith appeared a shining throng of angels praising God, who thus addressed their joyful song:

John records in Revelation 5 v 11 his vision of a large company of angels, Then I looked and heard the voice of many angels, numbering thousands upon thousands, and ten thousand times ten thousand.

Luke 2 v 14

'Glory to God in the highest heaven, and on earth peace to those on whom his favour rests.'

6 'All glory be to God on high, and to the earth be peace; good will henceforth from heaven to men begin and never cease.'

Revelation 5 v 12

John tells us that in his vision the angels praised God.

In a loud voice they were saying:

"Worthy is the Lamb, who was slain, to receive power and wealth and wisdom and strength and honour and glory and praise!"

Jesus said, Peace I leave with you; my peace I give you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled and do not be afraid.

John 14 v 27

Jesus brought peace and good will to earth. Evidence of this we see in His life, death and resurrection. We can experience this peace by trusting Jesus as our Saviour and Lord.

This famous paraphrase of Luke 2:8-14 by the poet Nahum Tate was first published in 1700.

Since then it has been published in the vast majority of hymn books.
