

How pleased and blest was I

This hymn by Isaac Watts is based on Psalm 122. There are also references to other passages.

The hymn is an expression of joy by people for being part of the community of believers, members of the Christian Church.

1 How pleased and blest was I,
To hear the people cry,
"Come, let us seek our God today!"
Yes, with a cheerful zeal,
We haste to Zion's hill,
And there our vows and honours pay.

This verse expresses the joy believers have when they come to worship together.

In Isaiah 2 v 3 we read

Many peoples will come and say,
'Come, let us go up to the mountain of the LORD,
to the temple of the God of Jacob.
He will teach us his ways,
so that we may walk in his paths.'
The law will go out from Zion,
the word of the LORD from Jerusalem.

Psalm 122 v 1 brings out the joy.

I rejoiced with those who said to me, 'Let us go to the house of the LORD.'

2 Zion, thrice happy place! Adorned with wondrous grace, And walls of strength embrace thee round; In thee our tribes appear, To pray, and praise, and hear The sacred gospel's joyful sound.

In Psalm 48 v 8 & 9 we read how God makes our place in his kingdom secure through his grace.

As we have heard,
so we have seen
in the city of the LORD Almighty,
in the city of our God:
God makes her secure
for ever. Within your temple, O God,
we meditate on your unfailing love.

Also Psalm 122 v 4 says

That is where the tribes go up —
the tribes of the LORD —
to praise the name of the LORD
according to the statute given to Israel.

3 There David's greater Son
Has fixed his royal throne;
He sits for grace and judgment there.
He bids the saints be glad;
He makes the sinner sad,
And humble souls rejoice with fear.

Jesus is both our saviour and judge. In Psalm 122 v 5 we read,

There stand the thrones for judgment, the thrones of the house of David.

In Hebrews 10 v 19 – 23 the writer explains that we receive grace through the sacrifice Jesus made for us on the cross.

Therefore, brothers and sisters, since we have confidence to enter the Most Holy Place by the blood of Jesus, by a new and living way opened for us through the curtain, that is, his body, and since we have a great priest over the house of God, let us draw near to God with a sincere heart and with the full assurance that faith brings, having our hearts sprinkled to cleanse us from a guilty conscience and having our bodies washed with pure water. Let us hold unswervingly to the hope we profess, for he who promised is faithful.

4 May peace attend thy gate,
And joy within thee wait,
To bless the soul of every guest;
The man that seeks thy peace,
And wishes thy increase,
A thousand blessings on him rest.

This verse and the first three lines of verse 5 are based on Psalm 122 v 6 – 9, a prayer for peace and security.

Pray for the peace of Jerusalem: 'May those who love you be secure.

May there be peace within your walls and security within your citadels.'
For the sake of my family and friends,
I will say, 'Peace be within you.'
For the sake of the house of the Lord our God,
I will seek your prosperity.

5 My tongue repeats her vows,
"Peace to this sacred house,"
For there my friends and kindred dwell;
And since my glorious God
Makes thee his blest abode,
My soul shall ever love thee well.

The last three lines of this verse refer back to the first verse of Psalm 122, expressing the joy experienced coming to worship.

This also can be seen in the first two verses of Psalm 84.

How lovely is your dwelling-place, Lord Almighty! My soul yearns, even faints, for the courts of the Lord; my heart and my flesh cry out for the living God.
