

That one day will come true,



#### Rock of Ages, cleft for me.

"Rock of Ages, cleft for me," is not a hymn we sing very often but it does have an interesting story behind it.

Augustus Toplady, the writer, was a curate at a church in Blagdon near the Mendip Hills in Somerset. There was an occasion when he was travelling along the gorge of Burrington Combe in the Hills when he was caught in a storm. The title came to Toplady when he found shelter in a gap in the gorge.

Augustus Toplady was born in Farnham in Surrey in 1740. He was ordained to the ministry of the Church of England in 1762 and was the vicar of Broadhembury, a small parish in Devon, from 1768. The last few years of his life were spent in London where he was a preacher at an independent chapel. He died of consumption in 1778.

The theme of the hymn is that the only way we can know God fully is to trust in Jesus. The power of our sin separates us from God. Jesus has paid the price necessary to free us from this power through his death and resurrection.

#### Verse 1.

Rock of Ages, cleft for me, Let me hide myself in Thee; Let the water and the blood, From Thy riven side which flowed, Be of sin the double cure, Save me from its guilt and power.

A request to hide ourselves in Jesus to save us from the guilt and power of our sin.

#### Psalm 18 v 2

The Lord is my rock, my fortress and my deliverer; my God is my rock, in whom I take refuge, my shield and the horn (strength) of my salvation, my stronghold.

#### Romans 3 v 23 - 25

for all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God, and all are justified freely by his grace through the redemption that came by Christ Jesus. God presented Christ as a sacrifice of atonement.



### THE DIARY OF A BMS SURGEON



#### Welcome to the diary of Kalbassou Doubassou, a BMS World Mission surgeon.

Kalbassou often starts his days by performing surgery. In one month, Guinebor II Hospital (G2) in Chad can receive over 570 patients in its emergency department. Without the hospital, they might turn to traditional healers or to buying medicines from unregulated street vendors, many of whom can unintentionally make their patients catastrophically ill.

All these operations are carried out despite the challenges that come from working in Chad. May is a notoriously hot month, the peak of Chad's dry season. Temperatures inside can hit 40 degrees, a difficult climate for anyone to work in, let alone perform surgery in. Then, there's political instability. Recently G2 Hospital shared that the country has fallen even further down the UN's Human Development Index, now ranking 190 out of 191 countries.

Along with all this, there are problems of accessing hardware and medicine for the hospital, such as screws to fix fractured limbs.

Kalbassou works through all this, despite a recent bout of flu and experiencing personal struggle, and rejoices that "the Good Shepherd is always in control". There are huge encouragements even in hardship. Two little girls, Halimé and Khadija, suffered a terrible accident when a wall fell on them as they were playing. Fortunately Kalbassou was there. "They received treatment and today a relationship has been created between the two families and me because of the good results," Kalbassou writes.

It's been a busy month, and Kalbassou's work isn't ending, but he is praising God for everything he's doing. The Chadian Minister of Health has granted more land for the hospital. Kalbassou has passed an orthopaedic course. And he's learning new ways of working interculturally. Fortunately, Kalbassou knows exactly where his strength comes from: "The Lord is gracious," he says, "to those who hope in him."

Ba Nuan went from not being able to see a way forward to living every day for Jesus. Her incredible story was made possible through your gifts to the Thailand Spring appeal.

As a child, Ba Nuan was sent to care for her grandmother when she became too elderly to look after herself. Though young, Ba Nuan grew up far from home, becoming both caregiver and breadwinner.

When Ba Nuan wasn't at school, she spent her free time labouring and collecting sticks to be sold for thatched roofs – with no time to dream about her future.

But as Ba Nuan grew, so did her work ethic. She opened a restaurant and worked as a medium to cure people believed to be cursed by black magic. Married with two children and a stable career, poverty gradually lost its grip.


But one day, Ba Nuan's world crumbled. She was heartbroken to discover her husband had been unfaithful and her business began to collapse. Then, tragically, Ba Nuan's husband took his own life. Alone and in despair, Ba Nuan couldn't

see a way forward. Until she was introduced to Jesus.

Ba Nuan was invited to the church run by BMS World Mission workers Helen and Wit Boondeekhun in Wang Daeng. There, she encountered unconditional love, from God and from her new community. "I didn't have any hope, my life was in despair," says Ba Nuan. "But now I have found a new life."

Amazingly, the village has gone from not knowing Jesus, to a community where eight new believers were baptised just last year. Excitingly, Ba Nuan was one of them. And she has this message for supporters: "Love God with all your mind, soul and strength, because God is powerful, and he can help you, and he loves you so much."
