

Let us Pray for people everywhere,


Open our Hearts to God's prompting!

Silent Night

The words to Silent Night were written in 1816 by Joseph Mohr, a Catholic priest. It was first performed on Christmas Eve 1818 at his Church in Oberndorf, near Salzburg in Austria. The music was written for this performance by Franz Gruber, the organist at a nearby church. Mohr brought the words to Gruber and asked him to compose a melody with guitar accompaniment as the church organ was damaged, possibly by flooding. When the organ was repaired the organ builder heard the hymn and was impressed by it. He took it back to his home in the Tyrol and introduced it to two travelling families of folk singers. These popularised it, initially in Austria and then further afield. It eventually reaching the USA in 1839.

1 Silent night! Holy night! All is calm, all is bright round the virgin and her child: holy infant so tender and mild, sleep in heavenly peace; sleep in heavenly peace!

'Silent night' concentrates on some of the detail from the main passage about the birth of Jesus recorded in Luke 2. In the first verse we see that Mary was a virgin.

Matthew wrote:

This is how the birth of Jesus the Messiah came about: His mother Mary was pledged to be married to Joseph, but before they came together, she was found to be pregnant through the Holy Spirit. Matthew $1 \vee 18$ In Isaiah 7 v 14 we find the prophesy:

Therefore the Lord himself shall give you a sign; Behold, a virgin shall conceive, and bear a son, and shall call his name Immanuel.

In John's gospel we read that John the Baptist gave witness to Jesus as, 'The true light that gives light to everyone was coming into the world.' John $1 \vee 9$

Everything was bright around the mother and child.

2 Silent night! Holy night! Shepherds quake at the sight, glory streams from heaven afar, heavenly hosts sing "Alleluia", Christ the Saviour is born, Christ the Saviour is born!

In verse 2 we find the shepherds afraid when the angel appeared And there were shepherds living out in the fields nearby, keeping watch over their flocks at night. ⁹ An angel of the Lord appeared to them, and he glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were terrified. Luke $2 \vee 8 \& 9$

In the fourth line the heavenly host sing....

¹³ Suddenly a great company of the heavenly host appeared with the angel, praising God and saying,
¹⁴ "Glory to God in the highest heaven, and on earth peace to those on whom his favour rests." Luke 2 v 13 & 14

The last two lines state that Jesus is the Saviour, Messiah. ...in the town of David a Saviour has been born to you; he is the Messiah, the Lord. This will be a sign to you: You will find a baby wrapped in cloths and lying in a manger." Luke 2 v 11 & 12

> 3 Silent night! Holy night! Son of God, love's pure light: radiant beams your holy face with the dawn of saving grace, Jesus, Lord, at your birth, Jesus, Lord, at your birth.

The third verse emphasises the fact that Jesus is God's Son and that Jesus brought saving grace to the world. John 1v 14

Paul wrote to the Corinthians:

For what we preach is not ourselves, but Jesus Christ as Lord....... For God, who said, "Let light shine out of darkness," made his light shine in our hearts to give us the light of the knowledge of God's glory displayed in the face of Christ. 2 Corinthians $4 \vee 5 \& 6$

Isaiah 9 v 2 contains the well-known words,

The people walking in darkness have seen a great light; on those living in the land of deep darkness a light has dawned.

It may have been night time when Jesus came into the world but in verse 1 we are told "All is bright", verse 2 has glory streaming from heaven and verse 3 contains references to "love's pure light" and "radiant beams".

Jesus said "I am the light of the world. Whoever follows me will never walk in darkness, but will have the light of life." John 8 v 12

There are two main translations that appear in our hymn books. The older one by John F Young is the one I have looked at. The other version is by Stopford A Brooke. (See Mission Praise 597). There are several other translations. There is a fourth verse below; this was added later.

Silent night, holy night, Wondrous star, lend thy light; With the angels let us sing "Alleluia" to our King; Christ the Saviour is born, Christ the Saviour is born.
